1. What difference has a YCE grant made to your group/organisation?

- To summarise:- Brixton Bee Wild Group have met monthly and developed our Bee Wild Action Plan. The plan has recorded our journey over our first year – copy attached.
- We have carried out monthly Wild Flower Surveys along the A379 and Winstone Lane.
- We have redesigned and replanted the wild flower bed at Chittleburn Hill to provide additional pollen for our insects and colour and interest for members of our community.
- We held a Bee Friendly Picnic Event in the school grounds where children built bug hotels and bird boxes. They took part in quizzes and other bee friendly activities – 40 people attended.
- We have organised a Tree Recognition Walk around the village.



1. cont'd What difference has a YCE grant made to your group/organisation?

- We have worked with the school to organise a logo competition and have adopted the winning design – 21 entries.
- We have carried out winter planting of spring flowering bulbs.
- We have liaised with grounds maintenance contractors to help improve the environment for our bees and insects by reducing mowing.
- We have planted 11 bee friendly trees with the help of 15 volunteers.
- We have publicised the work of the group in Brixton Parish Magazine and via Brixton Environmental Working Group.
- We have learned a lot about wild flowers, bees, our community and about connecting, communicating and working with other people and organisations.



2. How many people have been involved with the project (as volunteers, perhaps) or have benefitted from a YCE grant and were they all in your local parish/community?

Our Action Plan records the people and numbers involved for each area of our Action Plan. To-date the majority of people who have benefitted from the YCE grant live in the parish as set out in our original application form. As the group has become more established we are beginning to extend our involvement further afield.



3. Please state what environmental impacts you consider to have been delivered by using a YCE grant?

The group has focused on its organisational aims to improve the habitat and environment for bees, other insects and birds on land accessible by the public in Brixton Parish. Members of the group are also members of and have reported back to the Brixton Environmental Working Group on our activities.



4. Do you envisage your project continuing after the life of this grant?

Yes, we do envisage the project continuing after the life of this grant. We have for some time included a section on Forward Planning in our Action Plan. It sets out the framework for how, subject to funding, we would like the work of the group to move forward to continue improving the environment for the bees, insects and birds in our parish.
