
- 1. Clean air.



- Check Misconnections
- Maintenance of offline septic tanks
- Good Loo Behaviour (3 P's)
- Take the "strain off the drains"

- Save water in prolonged dry periods
- Manage invasive species
- Consider product sources
- Report environment incidents

General Binding Rules

- Sewage must be domestic in nature
- Buildings Regulations Approval
- Not cause pollution
- Releasing to ground; permit if:
 - Well, borehole deep structure
 - > 2000L per day
 - Groundwater protection zone
- Releasing to a surface water
 - Small sewage treatment plant; permit if:
 - >5000L per day

What is the WFD

- EU legislation requiring member states to make plans to protect and improve the water environment.
- WFD adopted in 2000 (UK law in 2003) and provided a common framework for water management and protection in Europe.
- Environment Agency are the lead competent authority for implementing the WFD in England.

- Environmental Bill
- Office for Environmental Protection
- Aligned 25 YEP and RBMP Targets of 75% waters at good



What are the key aims of WFD

- 1. Improve and protect inland and coastal waters
- 2. Obtain a sustainable use of water as a natural resource
- Create better habitats for wildlife that live in and around water
- 4. Create a better quality of life for everyone
