Local Government Reorganisation

National government signalled in December 2024 its intent to end the current system of District and County Councils and smaller unitary Councils. Instead, these are to be replaced by unitary Councils covering much larger areas, with a guideline minimum population of 500,000 people. Plymouth City Council (PCC), South Hams District Council (SHDC) and Devon County Council (DCC) have submitted initial plans to Government. The initial plans can be found on the DCC, PCC and SHDC websites.

Highways

BPC Traffic Management Working Group continues to meet remotely with DCC Highways Officer on a quarterly basis and the next meeting will be held in May. Parking on The Green

A small working group in collaboration with DCC Highways has produced a draft plan for parking on the Green. The plans will be available to view at the Community Room, St, Marys School on Tuesday 20th May from 7.00-9.00pm and Saturday 24th May from 10.00-12.00

Speed Limits within Brixton

BPC is working in conjunction with our District Councillors and DCC County Councillor Hart to reduce the speed limit between Red Lion Hill / Stamps Hill to Sherford. BPC have also asked for a review of the speed limits within the village. This would be a good opportunity to review the whole parish as speeding is a concern, especially since the reopening of the road between Brixton and Sherford.

Monkey Lane

DCC has issued a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) for Monkey Lane to be downgraded to a multi- use lane (Pedestrians, Cyclists and Horse Riders) with a prohibition of vehicles except for access. BPC has received detailed PDSs of the scheme plan, signposts, bollards and sign schedules for the proposed works. A temporary traffic order has been received, and these works will be completed during April.

It has also been confirmed that there will be a path, running alongside the hedge into the Sherford Country Park, this will join with the existing PROW

River Yealm Water Quality Group

This working group with the 7 Riparian Parish Councils in the River Yealm Catchment area together with other interested parties continues to meet to work with Environment Agency and South West Water to look at improving the quality of water in the River Yealm particularly relating to the discharge of sewage into the river at times of heavy rainfall. Cost Of Living Crisis

BPC is mindful of the 'Cost of Living' Crisis and a small working group of representatives from the community meets regularly to discuss this. A Community Help Box located in the porch at St. Mary's Church contains cleaning, hygiene products and tinned food funded by BPC, Brixton Feoffee Trust and donations. These items are being regularly used. The warm hub in The Foxhound is popular on Thursday afternoons and will continue as a regular community event to help reduce isolation and loneliness. Brixton Community Book Swop

The Brixton Community Book Swop is located in St Mary's Church and is available daily when the church is open from 10am - 4.30pm

There are books for all tastes including as election of children's books. If you don't have a book to swop, please just come and borrow one. There is no membership required or recording of book borrowing - just come along and swop your book. The library of books is expanding daily and well worth a visit.

Community Emergency Plan

BPC are looking to update their Community Emergency Plan and would welcome volunteers who would be interested in working on this project. This would be looking at local needs and ensuring the community is resilient and prepared to face any emergency.

Land at Cofflete Creek

BPC owns the parcel of land at the head of Cofflete Creek on the site of the former Cofflete Mill. Following consultation with parishioners, the aim is to create a community amenity space for the residents of Brixton Parish, through careful consideration of the significant historic and environmental value of this piece of land to the community. Following a successful public consultation in November 2024, options for the next stage of Cofflete were discussed.
