Brixton Parish Council News Bulletin

Welcome to the September news bulletin from Brixton Parish Council (BPC).

BPC has resumed the quarterly news bulletin, having produced weekly newsletters during the COVID-19 lockdown.

BPC are following guidance from Devon Association of Local Councils (DALC) and National Association of Local Councils (NALC) and continue to hold council meetings remotely and will do so for the foreseeable future. The meetings do follow the same format as the face to face meetings including the open forum, where all are welcome to join and discuss anything with councillors.

Land at Cofflete Creek

Work has been progressing with the stone wall being restored and fencing being erected. Cllr Parish will be looking for volunteers in the near future to progress the project plan.

Local Council Award Scheme

BPC is striving to achieve the coveted Local Council Award Scheme Quality Gold Award and have been working on a business plan which will be subject to a period of consultation. Parking / Traffic Calming

Following on from the initial meeting regarding parking around The Green and traffic calming on Red Lion Hill / Stamps Hill, BPC employed a consultant to look at these locations. Look out for the consultation coming soon.

Community Speedwatch

Community Speed Watch in Brixton is looking for more volunteers to help reduce speeding traffic through Brixton Village. Community Speedwatch was created by Devon & Cornwall Police to encourage residents of local towns and villages to volunteer to carry out main road vehicle speed checks.

Footpath 31

DCC have informed BPC of the planned 6 months temporary closure of Footpath No. 31, Brixton, starting on the 5th October 2020. The closure is necessary to enable demolition of the bridge. There is an alternative route which can be on the BPC website
